The 'A J Hickman' Silver Challenge Cup (Perpetual) presented by the New Forest Agricultural Show Society will be awarded to the competitor gaining most points in Classes 2–16 and 25, but excluding Classes 9 and 13.

The New Forest Beekeepers' Association Silver Challenge Bowl. (Perpetual) presented by Miss H Fair will be awarded to the competitor owning less than ten hives who gains most points in honey and beeswax classes.

The 'A. F. Wheeler' Silver Memorial Rose Bowl. (Perpetual) to be awarded to the exhibitor and member of the New Forest Beekeepers' Association, gaining most points in the Show.

The 'Salter Trophy' (Perpetual) presented by Miss M Salter will be awarded to the winner of Class 20.

The 'Charles Butler Trophy' (Perpetual) made and presented by Mr H W W Bisson will be awarded to the winner of Class 11.

The 'Burnham Trophy' (Perpetual) presented by Mrs P Burnham will be awarded for the most points in the wax classes.

The Novice Trophy (Perpetual) presented by T & M J Davies. To be awarded to the novice with the most points in the honey and beeswax classes in the Show. 2018

The 'Wauton Vase' (Perpetual) presented by Mr and Mrs E W B Wauton will be awarded to the best Mead in the Show.

RULES

1. Entries should be made on the form provided and must reach the Entries Secretary on or before 15th July 2018 or double fees may be levied. Exhibitors may make more than one entry in a class but no exhibitor may take more than one prize in any one class. Joint owners are not allowed to make separate entries.
2. Delivery of Exhibits. Personal delivery must be made between 2.30pm and 6pm on the day before the Show or between 7am and 8am on the first day of the Show. All vehicles must be removed from the Showground by 8.30am.
3. Staging. Exhibitors unable to stage their own exhibits will have them staged by appointed stewards. Judging will commence promptly at 8.30am.
4. Labels & Exhibiting. Labels supplied by the Secretary must be affixed to jars and bottles to leave 15mm between the bottom of the label and the bottom of the jar or bottle. Frames and square sections must have one label at the top right hand corner of the front vertical face of the showcase or container and the duplicate on top of the frame or section. Round sections must have one label on the circumference and the duplicate on the flat face. Cut comb must have one label on the case and the duplicate on the lid (new crystal containers only require one label). Labels for wax cakes, objects and moulds to be paced underneath and where possible displayed on a labelled white paper plate and shown in a clear plastic bag. Label for photograph to be fixed to the bottom right hand side of the mount.
5. Bona Fide. All honey and wax exhibited must be the bona fide produce of the exhibitors' own bees. Photographs must have been taken, but not necessarily processed, by the exhibitor.
6. Extracted Honey. Except where otherwise specified (i.e. Classes 8 & 11) all extracted honey must be exhibited in 454g clear squat jars, with standard gold plastic or metal commercial screw lids. All extracted honey to be graded with standard grading glasses.
7. Comb Honey. Except where otherwise specified i.e. (Class 11) must be shown in white commercial or crystal containers.
8. Gift Honey. All entries in the Gift Classes become the property of the New Forest & District Beekeepers' Association and will be sold for the benefit of the Funds. To facilitate this, only the gift exhibits gaining awards will be left on the bench after judging. To comply with the law, exhibitors must send legal labels with Gift class entries which will be affixed after judging and before sale.
9. A Novice is an exhibitor who has never won a 1st Prize for honey or beeswax.
10. Awards. The judges have discretion to withhold prizes in any class.
11. Objections. All Objections must be made in writing and handed to the Secretary of the Honey Section by 3pm on the first day of the Show together with a fee of £5.00 which will be forfeited if the objection is not soundly based. The decision of the Committee will be final.
12. Care of Exhibits. All ordinary care will be taken but the Committee will not be responsible in any circumstances for loss or damage sustained in any way whatsoever.
13. Removal of Exhibits. Exhibits may only be removed from the staging after 5.30pm on the last day of the Show and accompanied by a steward. Re-Admission of vehicles onto the Showground will be dictated on the day by the Showground Authority.
14. Trophies and Prize Money will be awarded at a prize giving on the last day at 5pm.
15. Powers of Committee. The Committee reserve the right to decline any entry without a reason being given, to submit any exhibit for analysis, and to dispose of any damaged honey to the best advantage.
16. Any dispute as to the interpretation of these rules shall be referred to the Committee.
